

UCPD Crime Alert: Sexual Assault Arrest

The University of California Police Department (UCPD) has arrested a Riverside man in connection with a sexual assault that occurred on the UCR campus.

On May 6, 2018, at about 3 p.m., a woman met with a man on campus after arranging for that meeting through a social media application. The survivor reported to police that a sexual assault occurred during that meeting.

UCPD conducted an investigation and arrested the suspect at his residence in the City of Riverside on May 9, 2018. UCPD has charged Jinhong Duan, 27, of Riverside with rape and false imprisonment, both felony offenses. He was booked in the Riverside County Jail with bail set at \$55,000.
