

UCPD Crime Alert: Sexual Assault Occurred on Campus

On, 5/12/18 at 7:30 p.m., a woman was dancing with a man she just met in front of the main stage at the UCR Spring Splash concert. While dancing, the man sexually assaulted the woman. The woman ran from the area and reported the incident to UCPD officers assigned to the event. The woman was not injured.

UCPD officers searched the concert venue for the suspect, but could not find him.

The suspect was described as:

- Asian male, 18-19 years old, 5'07" tall, thin build with black shoulder length hair and brown eyes
