

UCPD Crime Alert: Attempted Robbery Occurred On Campus

On Tuesday, March 8th, 2016, at about 12:40 a.m., UCPD officers were dispatched to the area of Aberdeen Drive, just north of the intersection with North Campus Road, regarding an attempted robbery. The victim and a friend were walking on Aberdeen Drive when a vehicle approached them with multiple occupants inside. One of the passengers got out of the vehicle with a baseball bat and demanded the victim's phone.

The victim declined, explaining that he had an old phone. The suspect laughed, reentered the vehicle and left the area with the other occupants, heading north on Aberdeen Drive towards Linden Street.

Neither the victim nor his friend were hurt in the incident. UCPD officers responded but were unable to find the suspect's vehicle.

UCPD detectives are investigating this crime and we will update our community if we can develop information that would be helpful in the apprehension of the suspects.

The suspect vehicle was occupied by five subjects: two Hispanic male adults in their early 20's and three black male adults in their early 20's. The victim could describe only two of the five, as follows:

- The first suspect was a black male adult in his early twenties, last seen wearing blue sweat pants with "UCR" printed on the right leg and a black sweatshirt.
- The second suspect was a heavy-set Hispanic male adult in his early twenties, last seen wearing dark colored sweats shirt and pants.
- The victim described the vehicle as an early 2000's silver, 4-door sedan.
