## **UCPD Crime Alert: Assault Occurred in the Residence Halls**

UCPD officers are investigating a report of an assault which occurred in the campus Residence Halls during the early morning hours of January 20, 2017. The victim reported to officers that, on the night of January 19, 2017, he attended an off-campus social gathering at a private residence. He left the gathering shortly after being involved in a minor altercation and returned to his residence hall room, on campus. About three hours after returning to his hall, an unknown group of three men knocked on his door; when he answered, the group assaulted the victim with their fists and then left the area.

The victim sustained non-life threatening injuries, sufficient enough to require medical attention. At this time there is no description available for the suspects in this crime. If officers are able to obtain a description of any or all of the suspects, UCPD will update the campus community via a follow-up notice to this crime alert.
