

UCPD Crime Alert: Lewd Act Occurred on Campus

On 06/13/2018, at 10:55 a.m., a female student was walking in the area of West Big Springs Road and UCR Lot 13 when she was approached by a man driving a newer black 4 door sedan, with partial California license plate: 7GPX. The man asked her for directions to the botanical gardens. When the student provided directions, he began masturbating. The student walked away and called UCPD. The suspect drove away east bound on Big Springs Road.

The suspect was described as follows:

- White male, mid to late 20's, skinny, blue eyes, short brown hair, acne, droopy eyes and a long face, wearing a gray hoodie and basketball shorts

UCPD officers responded and checked the area, but could not find the suspect. UCPD will be investigating this crime.
