## **UCPD Crime Alert: Robbery Occurred Near Campus**

On February 24, 2019 at 11:35 pm, a male UCR student was walking northbound on the west sidewalk of Canyon Crest Drive between the UCR lot 26 entrance and Blaine Street. A male subject got out of a parked vehicle and touched the student's left shoulder from behind. The student turned around and was punched in the neck by the suspect. The student kicked the suspect and ran north towards Blaine Street, dropping his headphones. The student ran to his apartment and called police.

The suspect was described as light skinned male, possibly Asian, 18-21 years old, 5'7" tall, 145 lbs., maybe dark hair, wearing a dark hoodie. No facial hair. The suspect's vehicle was described as a white sedan occupied by three other individuals and was last seen driving southbound Canyon Crest Drive towards Linden Street. The area was searched by responding UCPD and RPD officers, but the suspect vehicle was not found.

The Riverside Police Department is investigating this crime. Please use caution when walking near parked vehicles during the hours of darkness.
