UCPD Crime Alert: Robbery Occurred Near Campus

On 7/28/18, at about 2:00 a.m., a robbery occurred on Rustin Ave. just outside of the pedestrian gate of the Woodlands Apartments (Rustin Ave. and Blaine St.). Two men were parking their car on the west side of Rustin Ave. when they noticed a man and a woman walk past their car. When they got out of their car, the man shoved one of the victims in the chest and verbally threatened him. The woman forcefully took both victim's cell phones and wallets and the suspects ran from the area. Neither of the victims were injured.

Suspect descriptions:

Male suspect: Black male, 25 - 30 years old, medium to dark complexion, Goatee style facial hair, tall, regular build, black curly hair, Last seen wearing a black t-shirt or tank top with black shorts.

Female suspect: Black female, 25 - 30 years old, tall, curly black hair, medium build, last seen wearing black clothing.

The Riverside Police Department is investigating this crime. Please use caution when traveling and parking your car in dark areas in the early morning hours.
