## **UCPD Crime Alert: Robbery Occurred on Campus**

On 08/12/19, at 9:03 pm, a UCR student was walking on the sidewalk in the area of 500 Big Springs Rd. on campus. Two males got out of a silver colored, 4 door sedan (unknown license plate number) that was driving slowly on Big Springs Rd. Both males blocked the student's path on the sidewalk and asked him for the time. One suspect then hit the victim in the face as he demanded the victim's phone. After taking the phone, the suspects fled to the vehicle which drove eastbound on Big Springs Rd. towards Watkins Dr. The student had minor injuries and declined medical treatment. UCPD officers checked the area, but could not find the suspect.

The male suspects were both described as having light brown complexions, 20-25 years old, approximately 5'09" tall, average build, and black hair, wearing black T-Shirts and dark colored shorts.
